## Readings

First Reading: **Ruth 3.1-5; 4.13-17**

**3** Naomi her mother-in-law said to her, 'My daughter, I need to seek some security for you, so that it may be well with you. Now here is our kinsman Boaz, with whose young women you have been working. See, he is winnowing barley tonight at the threshing-floor. Now wash and anoint yourself, and put on your best clothes and go down to the threshing-floor; but do not make yourself known to the man until he has finished eating and drinking. When he lies down, observe the place where he lies; then, go and uncover his feet and lie down; and he will tell you what to do.' She said to her, 'All that you tell me I will do.' **4** So Boaz took Ruth and she became his wife. When they came together, the Lord made her conceive, and she bore a son. Then the women said to Naomi, 'Blessed be the Lord, who has not left you this day without next-of-kin; and may his name be renowned in Israel! He shall be to you a restorer of life and a nourisher of your old age; for your daughter-in-law who loves you, who is more to you than seven sons, has borne him.' Then Naomi took the child and laid him in her bosom, and became his nurse. The women of the neighbourhood gave him a name, saying, 'A son has been born to Naomi.' They named him Obed; he became the father of Jesse, the father of David.

Second Reading: **Hebrews 9.23-28**

Thus it was necessary for the sketches of the heavenly things to be purified with these rites, but the heavenly things themselves need better sacrifices than these. For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself. And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgement, so

Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

### **Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ**

As he taught, he said, 'Beware of the scribes, who like to walk around in long robes, and to be greeted with respect in the market-places, and to have the best seats in the synagogues and places of honour at banquets! They devour widows' houses and for the sake of appearance say long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation.' He sat down opposite the treasury, and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny. Then he called his disciples and said to them, 'Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on.'

**2018 Annual Meeting of the Parish of Box Hill** will commence at **10.30 am** following the earlier Sung Eucharist that **Sunday 25 November 2018** at 9 am (nb, the earlier start to the service).

**Elections: Churchwardens, Parish Council Members and Incumbency Committee Lay Members** During the Annual Meeting, elections will be held for 2 Churchwardens, 6 members of Parish Council and 2 lay members of the Incumbency Committee. Nominations are invited for these positions using the correct form available from the welcomers, Parish Office or the Parish Secretary (Keith Wilkins). Completed forms need to be submitted to the Vicar by 12 noon Friday 16 November 2018. To be eligible to stand for election and to nominate/vote, you must be currently listed on the Parish Electoral Roll.

### **Revision of the Parish Electoral Roll**

To maintain currency, a revision of the Parish Electoral Roll will be undertaken by the Electoral Committee commencing Noon Thursday 8 November 2018. A copy of the assumed Electoral Roll will be displayed on the Undercroft noticeboard and available to be cited from the Parish Secretary (Keith Wilkins). If you are not currently listed and would like to be, please use the application form available from the Parish Office, Welcomers/Sidespeople or Keith Wilkins. Applications are submitted to the Parish Secretary. Criteria includes being at least 18 yo, baptised, confirmed or received into membership of the Anglican Church of Australia, not on any other parish roll, and regularly and habitually attend public worship in the parish (considered to have attended worship 12 times in the previous 12 months and 3 times in the preceding 3 months).
