### Our Vicar Writes...

Welcome to worship today! We welcome newly ordained Priest Alasdair to *preside* for the first time at both our English-speaking services this morning. Welcome also to what traditionally has been called 'stir-up' Sunday; so named from the first words of the traditional collect prayer for this day, where we pray for God to 'stir-up' God's people for action! It was also the day when people began the process of making Christmas cakes. Today also marks the end of the Christian liturgical year. Next week marks the beginning of Advent – the season of preparation before the celebration of Christmas. But before we start Advent we celebrate most importantly today the feast of Christ the King, the culmination of this season after Pentecost. When we proclaim that Jesus is our Lord and King we do two things: First, we effectively say that this world is *not* our Lord. Jesus is our Lord and Sovereign and there is no other! Now while we are all bound to many ties in our lives; family, church, community and nation, none of these overrides our primary allegiance to Christ. And second, while it may be easy to say that Jesus is our Lord it is harder to live this out in practice. We are always being reminded in Scripture of the need for our faith to be evident in our behaviour, in our love and concern and aid for the last and least among us. We can only do this in the power of God's Spirit always aware of God's grace to us and the hope we have been given. Let our prayer today be like that of the words of today's collect that God may stir us up to live in Christ and grow in the life offered to all!

Now these are the last words of David: The oracle of David, son of Jesse, the oracle of the man whom God exalted, the anointed of the God of Jacob, the favourite of the Strong One of Israel: The spirit of the Lord speaks through me, his word is upon my tongue. The God of Israel has spoken, the Rock of Israel has said to me: One who rules over people justly, ruling in the fear of God, is like the light of morning, like the sun rising on a cloudless morning, gleaming from the rain on the grassy land. Is not my house like this with God? For he has made with me an everlasting covenant, ordered in all things and secure. Will he not cause to prosper all my help and my desire? But the godless are all like thorns that are thrown away; for they cannot be picked up with the hand; to touch them one uses an iron bar or the shaft of a spear. And they are entirely consumed in fire on the spot.




## ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING
