Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed! Welcome to our worship today at St Peter's. Happy Mother's Day to all Mothers present with us and those mothers who are fondly remembered. Sometimes when we come to church, we can find the readings presented by the Lectionary for that Sunday uninspiring or difficult or disjointed yet sometimes we are spoilt by the richness of God's word with images and ideas and thoughts and 'Gospel – good news' abounding from every angle. Today's selection of passages is such a week. The appointed psalm (Psalm 23) reminds us of God's grace in our lives in every situation '*Even though we walk through the valley of the shadow of death*' – we are loved and nurtured and more importantly – we are blessed! And in the Gospel passage from John we are presented with the wonderful image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd – the one who calls his sheep (who calls us!) The one who provides the way (I am the gate) into life in all its abundance. As we reflect upon the treasures presented to us this Sunday; as we gather as speakers of many tongues across the course of today – may God comfort us who are disturbed and disturb us who are comfortable! May God open our ears to hear and respond once more to the good news that God is with us in all of life; that in Jesus we may find abundant life and that in coming together for our worship like the early church we may become those who go out and change the world.

Prayer of the Day

Gracious God, you sent Jesus, the good shepherd, to gather us together: may we not wander from his flock, but follow wherever he leads us, listening for his voice and staying near him, until we are safely in your fold, to live with you for ever; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

First Reading: Acts 9.36-43

Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, 'Please come to us without delay.' So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, 'Tabitha, get up.' Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

Second Reading: Revelation 7.9-17

After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying, 'Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, singing, 'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.' Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?' I said to him, 'Sir, you are the one that knows.' Then he said to me, 'These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will

hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; for the Lamb at the centre of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.'

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

At that time the festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, 'How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly.' Jesus answered, 'I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep. My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand. The Father and I are one.'

BIBLE STUDY The Land and its Loss – Faith, Identity and Nationalism

In April our Bible study explored the centrality of the Land to the Israelite people and their faith in God and identity as God's people. When the people were exiled to Babylon, and in the following centuries of restoration, conquest, rebellion and imperial domination, several different religious responses arose to view these experiences as revealing God's action and character. These responses ranged from purity (Pharisees), separation (Essenes), armed uprising (Zealots) and temple ritual (Sadducees). Jesus stood against all these responses and showed that the nation's fate was not the result of God's punishment, that the nation would not be restored by the violent intervention of God, and that God's mercy extended beyond the boundaries of their nationalised view of Israel.

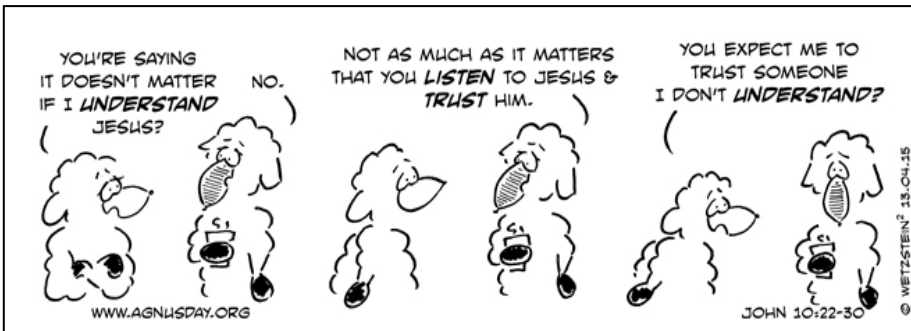
