The Vicar writes...

Welcome to our online and in person worship today! Thank you to everyone who helped in any way with the celebration last Sunday as we farewelled Father Harry and Pam Kerr. We are coming close to the end of the Epiphany season with Lent beginning on Wednesday week 17 February. The focus of this season has been the revelation of Jesus as God's chosen one and this week we have in our Gospel a seemingly simple account of the ministry of Jesus which highlights facets of the ministry we have today as his followers: healing, service, and proclaiming. We should endeavour always to be searching for opportunities to offer God's grace to those gathered around the door of our church; we should endeavour always to be people who serve others; and we should endeavour always to be proclaiming that God's reign is always at hand. It is important to note that here at the beginning of Jesus ministry, his first healing is accomplished through gentle, even tender, touch. One writer has said that "Love not expressed, love not felt, is difficult to trust." We believe that Jesus is the incarnation of God's love, which makes it demanding, if not also frightening, to realise that for some people, we are the only Jesus they will ever meet! As we lead up to Lent may we reflect upon our calling.

We give thanks to God for Bishop George's 56th anniversary of ordination last Tuesday on the Feast of Candlemas and in honour of this we have this prayer for Candlemas:

Almighty and ever-living God, clothed in majesty, whose beloved Son was this day presented in the Temple, in substance of our flesh: grant that we may be presented to you with pure and clean hearts, by your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

Readings

First Reading: Isaiah 40.21-31

²¹ Have you not known? Have you not heard? Has it not been told you from the beginning? Have you not understood from the foundations of the earth? ²² It is he who sits above the circle of the earth, and its inhabitants are like grasshoppers; who stretches out the heavens like a curtain, and spreads them like a tent to live in; ²³ who brings princes to naught, and makes the rulers of the earth as nothing. ²⁴ Scarcely are they planted, scarcely sown, scarcely has their stem taken root in the earth, when he blows upon them, and they wither, and the tempest carries them off like stubble. ²⁵ To whom then will you compare me, or who is my equal? says the Holy One. ²⁶ Lift up your eyes on high and see: Who created these? He who brings out their host and numbers them, calling them all by name; because he is great in strength, mighty in power, not one is missing. ²⁷ Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, 'My way is hidden from the Lord, and my right is disregarded by my God'? 28 Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. ²⁹ He gives power to the faint, and strengthens the powerless. 30 Even youths will faint and be weary, and the voung will fall exhausted: 31 but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

Psalm: 147.1-11

- ¹ O praise the Lord, for it is good to sing praises to our God: and to praise him is joyful and right.
- ² The Lord is rebuilding Jerusalem: he is gathering together the scattered outcasts of Israel.
- ³ He heals the broken in spirit: and binds up their wounds.
- ⁴ He counts the number of the stars: and calls them all by name.

- ⁵ Great is our Lord, and great is his power: there is no measuring his understanding.
- ⁶ The Lord restores the humble: but he brings down the wicked to the dust.
- ⁷ O sing to the Lord a song of thanksgiving: sing praises to our God upon the harp.
- ⁸ He covers the heavens with cloud, and prepares rain for the earth: and makes the grass to sprout upon the mountains.
- ⁹ He gives the cattle their food: and feeds the young ravens that call to him.
- He takes no pleasure in the strength of a horse: nor does he delight in anyone's legs,
- ¹¹ But the Lord's delight is in those that fear him: who wait in hope for his mercy.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 9.16-23

¹⁶ If I proclaim the gospel, this gives me no ground for boasting, for an obligation is laid on me, and woe betide me if I do not proclaim the gospel! ¹⁷ For if I do this of my own will, I have a reward; but if not of my own will, I am entrusted with a commission. ¹⁸ What then is my reward? Just this: that in my proclamation I may make the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my rights in the gospel. ¹⁹ For though I am free with respect to all, I have made myself a slave to all, so that I might win more of them. ²⁰ To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though I myself am not under the law) so that I might win those under the law. ²¹ To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law) so that I might win those outside the law. ²² To the weak I became weak, so that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, so that I might by any means save some. ²³ I do it all for the sake of the gospel, so that I may share in its blessings.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark, Chapter 1, verses 29-39

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

²⁹ As soon as they left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. ³⁰ Now Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told him about her at once. ³¹ He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them. ³² That evening, at sunset, they brought to him all who were sick or possessed with demons. ³³ And the whole city was gathered around the door. ³⁴ And he cured

many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons; and he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him. ³⁵ In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed. ³⁶ And Simon and his companions hunted for him. ³⁷ When they found him, they said to him, 'Everyone is searching for you.' ³⁸ He answered, 'Let us go on to the neighbouring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do.' ³⁹ And he went throughout Galilee, proclaiming the message in their synagogues and casting out demons.




Why did God require of Abraham that he sacrifice his son Isaac on the altar when Isaac was twelve years old?
