The Vicar writes...

It is so good to welcome many to our first in-person worship for such a long time! It is great to be able to gather together as God's people to break open God's word and share God's Holy meal. It is a fitting day to come to church for today in the lectionary cycle of readings the church celebrates the feast of 'All Saints'. We give thanks to all who have gone before us in the faith and we reflect upon the call for all of us to be 'God's saints' – God's *HOLY* people. The word 'Saint' is used 62 times in the New Testament and St Paul uses it 44 times to refer to the church on earth – to us! We are the saints of God. We are called to be what we are! On one hand yes this does refer to maturing in the faith and changing how we live but on the other hand it refers to the fact that God is with us – in fact, in us. St Paul refers to us as 'being IN CHRIST!' God is *HOLY* and the process of deepening our relationship with God is the process of opening our hearts more and more to the transforming presence of God's Holy Spirit. This is how we grow into what we already are – the Saints of God. May our prayer and desire today be that our hearts are once more opened to God's Spirit of grace and transformation!

First Reading: Isaiah 25.6-9

6 On this mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-matured wines, of rich food filled with marrow, of well-matured wines strained clear. 7 And he will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that is spread over all nations; 8 he will swallow up death for ever. Then the Lord God will wipe away the tears from all faces, and the disgrace of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken. 9 It will be said on that day, Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, so that he might save us. This is the Lord for whom we have waited; let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation.

Second Reading: Revelation 21.1-6a

1 Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. 2 And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. 3 And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, 'See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them; 4 he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away.' 5 And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new.' Also he said, 'Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.' 6 Then he said to me, 'It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life.'

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to John, Chapter 11, starting at verse 1

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

³² When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, 'Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.' ³³ When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. ³⁴ He said, 'Where have you laid him?' They said to him, 'Lord, come and see.' ³⁵ Jesus began to weep. ³⁶ So the Jews said, 'See how he loved him!' ³⁷ But some of them said, 'Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?' ³⁸ Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. ³⁹ Jesus said, 'Take away the stone.' Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, 'Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead for four days.' ⁴⁰ Jesus said to her, 'Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?' ⁴¹ So they took away the stone. And Jesus looked upwards and said, 'Father, I thank you for having heard me. ⁴² I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me.' ⁴³ When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, 'Lazarus, come out!' ⁴⁴ The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, and let him go.'

2 BILLION KILOMETRES TO SAFETY

Sophia will again be participating in the fundraising initiative of the UN Refugee Agency – 2 Billion Km to Safety (2BK for short) – which will run through November. The goal is to walk 238 Km – the distance covered by a family - mother Hadeel, father and their three children, a 4 year old and 2 year old twins, to escape from Syria.

As we know, people are suffering greatly as they are displaced, especially at present in Afghanistan and Yemen. UNHCR provides real, practical assistance where help is urgently needed.
